4. Employment and Unemployment

Number and composition of economically active population employed in the economy, unemployed, wages and salary of women and men, working conditions and traumatism in selected industries of the economy.

Data on economic activity of population, employment and unemployment of women and men were obtained on the basis of returns of the survey on employment, had been conducted by statistical bodies of the Russian Federation in 1995 during the last week of October and since 1999 quarterly during the last week of February, May, August and November.

This survey is conducted in all regions of the Russian Federation, excepting Chechen Republic, on the basis of the sample method and following distribution of the returns to total population of the observing age.

The units of observation are households and persons of 15-72 years – members of these households.

Data on employment and unemployment by regions of the Russian Federation are compiled on the basis of files with aggregated individual data for four consequent quarters which represent the average annual for the reference period.

The economically active population - persons of age, established for economic activity measurement, who are either employed or unemployed during the reference period.

The employed in the economy are those persons who during the reference period performed some work for wage or salary being employed or getting some income not being employed with or without attraction of employees. The employed comprise persons who performed some auxiliary work for family enterprise as well as persons who were temporary not at work for any specific reason, including illness, care of patient, annual vacation or days off, studying, educational vacations, vacation with wages paid partly or without any remuneration by the initiative of the administration (not less than 6 months), strikes, other similar reasons. The employed also comprise those who were at work for households to produce goods and service for sale.



The unemployed according to the standards of International Labour Organization (ILO) comprise persons above specified age approved to measure the economic activity of population who during the reference period met the following criteria:

- were without work (without paid employment);
- were searching a job, i.e. appealed to a state or commercial employment service, used announcements in mass media, addressed administration of an enterprise (an employer), used personal relations or undertook measures to establish their own business.
 - were ready to work

Pupils, students, pensioners and invalids do not comprise the unemployed if they were searching a job or were ready to work.

The unemployed registered at the State employment service comprise citizens of working age searching a job and ready to work, who had no work and wages or salary (labour income) living on the territory of the Russian Federation, registered at the center of employment to search an appropriate job.

Economic activity rate of age-specified group of population – the ratio of economically active population age-specified group to total population size of the respective age group in percent.

Economically inactive population – persons above specified age approved to measure the economic activity of population who during the reference period were neither employed nor unemployed.


The level of unemployment of age-specified group of population - the ratio of number of age-specified group of unemployed population to the economically active population of the respective age group in percent.

Persons of working age – women of 16-54 years, men of 16-59 years.

Victims at working place – persons suffered from accidents which entailed temporary or long disability or death and happened during performance of their obligations (work) on the territory of the organization or outside as well as during the way to or from working place with transport, provided by the organization.



4.1. Breakdown of Population of 15-72 years old by Economic Activity Rate, end of November 2003 The share of the respective sex of total population (%)







4.2. Economic Activity Rate of Women and Men ¹⁾ by Age Groups in 1995-2003




