- The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) global initiative
- Ensures conditions and promotes the implementation of the Convention on the Rights of the Child at the municipal level.
- Child Friendly Cities are established all over the world. The International Secretariat for Child Friendly Cities in Florence, Italy, coordinates their work.



WHAT IS A CHILD FRIENDLY CITY? • THREE BASIC FEATURES:

- 1. A child-friendly city is a liveable place for all children (environment, ecology, services, housing, education, healthcare, social welfare, etc.)
- It a city where not a single child is marginalised and the rights of all children without exception are respected (including disabled children, migrants, etc.)
- It is a city where children's views on all matters affecting them are listened to and

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 A city for children is not a model of an ideal city. It is a programme which, when implemented, would transform every city into a place where all children are able to enjoy a happy and comfortable life.



STRATEGÝ FOR BUILDING CHILD-FRIENDLÝ CITIES – PRINCIPAL REQUIREMENTS

- Development goals are clearly defined.
- Actions or activities are identified to reach the fixed goals.
- Quantitative indicators for the stated goals are developed.
- Mechanisms are enforced to monitor strategy implementation, collection and review of the data on goal progress indicators.
- A system is put in place to assess implementation impact and exercise control (supervisory boards, commissions, etc.).
- Sources of adequate financing are identified, as well as time frame and persons in charge of the
